

Project Area


- Wet meadows threatened by invasive and expansive species
- O Potentially suitable habitats for the marsh fritillary butterfly (Euphydryas aurinia)
- Vernal pools releasing detritus the only food of the freshwater pearl mussel (Margaritifera

margaritifera) – into the watercourse

Management

- O Grazing Exmoor ponies
- Mowing and fire management Restoration of native meadow communities
- O Clearance Removal of non-native poplar trees growing over wet meadows
- Restoring an old abandoned orchard Planting local fruit tree varieties
- O Closing drainage channels





Objectives

Restoration of degraded wet meadow communities
Improvement of conditions for the marsh fritillary (Euphydrias aurinia) and the freshwater pearl mussel (Margaritifera margaritifera)
Improvement of the water balance of the area
Environmental education

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
